



COLORADO WILDERNESS FLY FISHING PRICES AND REFERENCES

Fly Fishing is a Great Sport Anyone Can Enjoy! Experience superb fly fishing in the Flat Tops Wilderness of Colorado, accessible only by horseback and pack string of mules. Hard to get to, but impossible to forget. Wade, walk and float for native wild cutthroat, native wildbrook and rainbow trout. Inflatable pontoon float crafts provided at Island Lake. We offer seven different services to fulfill your high country flyfishing and expectations June through September. If you don't find the exact trip that's right for you, let us know and we'll customize one that fits your needs. You can bring your own belly boat for some of the smaller lakes fishing. Stream fishing is all walk and wade.

1. Indian Cliffs Base Camp, 9,200' Elevation

Located at the end of the road at the edge of the Flat Tops Wilderness, you can enjoy excellent stream, beaver pond and high country lake fishing from this camp. We ride out to fish each morning, and return to the base camp in the evening. It is our only camp that can be reached by four-wheel drive. It's convenient and comfortable, and a hot shower can sure feel good at the end of a great day of riding and fishing.
1 to 8 Day Trips Available\$240 Per Person Per Day

2. Island Lake Pack-In Camp, 11,000' Elevation

This is one of our most remote camps, accessible by horseback and pack-string only. Fishing is within easy walking distance and other lakes and streams are accessible by horseback in the area. The scenery here can only be described as spectacular and the fishing is superb. Because of the remoteness of this camp, a minimum four-day trip is required.
4 to 8 Day Trips Available\$300 Per Person Per Day

3. Combination Indian Cliffs Base & Island Lake Pack-In Camps

This plan combines the Indian Cliffs Base and Island Lake Pack-In camps. We generally spend a couple days fishing from base camp, then fish our way to our Island Lake Pack-In Camp. The number of days each place is up to you. This is a great opportunity to fish a variety of Colorado's finest waters and enjoy some of the Rocky Mountains most magnificent scenery.
5-Day Trip \$1,400 Per Person
7-Day Trip \$1,800 Per Person

4. Fly Fishing School

This is a great opportunity to learn or hone your fly fishing skills. The learn-by-doing schools are held in our Indian Cliffs Base Camp, Headwaters, Island Lake Pack-In or a combination of these camps, depending on the specific techniques being taught. All phases of high country fly fishing are fishing equipment and waders are provided. Minimum 2 people.
3-Day School\$900 Per Person
5-Day School \$1,500 Per Person

5. Pack-In Fly Fishing Drop Camp

These are for do-it-yourself camps for people who feel comfortable in the wilderness on their own. Camps are located on streams or lakes, or in areas where you can fish both. Many sites are available depending on the fishing you're most interested in. Camps are pre-set and include heavy-duty wall tents with floors and rain flies, cots and foam pads, L.P. cook stove with cooking utensils and a wood stove for heating. You provide food, eating utensils, personal, and fishing gear. We provide one saddle horse and one pack mule per person.

6. Deluxe Pack-In Fly Fishing Drop Camp

These unguided camps are identical to our regular Pack-In Drop Camps (#5), except that we provide groceries, a cook to prepare three great meals each day, and a camp jack to cut firewood and do all camp chores. This allows more time for fishing and enjoying the serenity of the high country wilderness. A minimum of four days and six people are required.
4 to 8 Day Trips \$300 Per Person Per Day

7. Packing Service

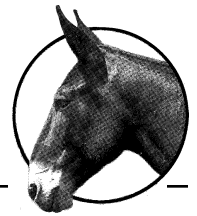
This service is provided for the experienced fly fishing camper and backpacker who brings his own camping equipment. One saddle horse and pack mule is furnished per person. We handle the packing and take you to the camp site. We'll assist you with site selection in an area that has the type of fishing you prefer. The weight limit per pack mule is 140 pounds and a minimum of 2 people is required. 1 saddle and 1 pack mule per person.
\$600 Per Person - Regardless of number of days spent (3 Day Minimum) 2 person minimum

Services/camps 1,2,3 and 4 are full-service and include meals, lodging and guides.
All camps are furnished with a Motorola 2-way radio for safety, convenience and
24-hour communication with our base camp.
A 50% deposit is required to reserve and confirm your trip.

GENERAL INFORMATION



Full-Service Guided Fishing Trips - Includes all meals, lodging (tent camps), guides and saddle horses, pack mules, riding instructions (if needed), to provide you a safe and enjoyable fishing trip.

Fishing Drop Camps - These are not guided camps with horses. Camps are described in this brochure. We will pack you and your supplies in at the beginning of your trip and then pack you back to the base camp at the end of your stay. You will be furnished with a saddle horse to ride to your drop camp and pack out. Saddle horses will not be left in the camp. Price includes packers and all pack mules needed.

Packing Service - Price includes packers and pack mules to pack your camp, gear, and supplies into a pre-arranged location in the wilderness. You will be furnished with a saddle horse to ride in and out. This service can be for fishing, camping, hiking, etc. We do all the packing. A Motorola radio is provided for your safety.

Price of Trips, Rides, and Packing Service - Does not include your fishing licenses, taxidermy service, transportation to and from airport or motel.

Reservations and Bookings - To confirm a trip or service, a 50% deposit is required to hold the dates you desire. We suggest you make your reservations early, as many dates are popular and fill up quickly.

Deposit Policy - Deposits are accepted in personal checks, money orders, company checks, or credit cards. Deposits are totally non-refundable. If some member of your party cancels, their deposit is forfeited and cannot be applied toward the balance of the trip. The price per person may change if a member of your group cancels and your group was given a group rate.

Final Payment - Final payment is due upon your arrival at base camp. It must be made in the form of cash or traveler's checks only. No checks or credit cards will be accepted under any circumstances. No exceptions will be made.

Fishing License Information - A Colorado fishing license is required for all persons 16 years of age or older. Fishing licenses can be purchased over the counter at most sporting goods stores in Colorado. Non-resident 5-day fishing licenses are \$21.00, and additional days are \$9.00 per day. Annual non-resident licenses are \$56.00. Colorado residents annual licenses are \$26.00. You are required to purchase your own license before arriving at base camp.

General Information - If you arrive before your scheduled trip there will be an additional meal fee. Breakfast \$10.00, lunch \$8.00, and Dinner \$18.00.

Non-Riding, Non-Fishing Guests - Are always welcome at our Indian Cliff Base Camp for those who enjoy the great outdoors and camp life, but do not wish to ride or fish. There will be a \$100 charge per day for this service.

Saddle Horses and Mules - No matter how much riding experience you've had (if any), we will outfit you with the right horse for your ability. Any guest who is over 240 pounds or very heavy for their height should let us know before making reservations. On all of our guided trips, clients' riding horses are furnished with Oilskin Rain slickers and saddle bags. Horses and mules are not allowed to be taken from our camps without being accompanied by a guide or packer.

Commercial Flights - Flights are scheduled daily into the Eagle/Vail airport. We can make arrangements to pick-up and return our guests to the airport if necessary, but let us know your travel plans at least 30 days prior to your arrival. Anyone who is flying make flight plans to arrive the day before they are scheduled to be in our base camp and the day after you are scheduled to depart.

When Booking - Please let us know of any health needs, physical conditions and dietary needs that we should know of in order to assure you have a safe and enjoyable trip with us.

Weather Conditions - June through September - Expect warm, days (60° to 75°) with occasional afternoon rain showers. The possibility of light snow always exists in the Rocky Mountains, even in July and August. Expect cool nights, (30° to 50°) so bring a suitable sleeping bag, rated at 10° or 20°, and clothing appropriate for cool evenings. After you have booked a trip with us, we will send each member of your party a detailed suggested item list of clothing and gear necessary, and additional information to help you plan your trip with us.

Alcohol - Absolutely no alcohol will be allowed to be consumed before or during the ride/fishing trip. In the evenings, alcohol is allowed, but in very moderate use only. Excessive alcohol use or any illegal drug use will not be tolerated, and if necessary you will be asked to leave our camp at once and will be escorted out of the wilderness.

Tipping - Even though tipping is not mandatory, it is certainly customary to tip your guide, packer and cook, if you feel that they did a good job for you. It is greatly appreciated.
